Allie Art

[Allie Art](#) is run by Alexandra ("Allie") Guard, an artist with Down syndrome from Cincinnati, Ohio. Allie's art is bursting with color and very intricate. She creates [framed wall art](#) as well as [jewelry](#) and [accessories](#). Allie's work has also been featured in several news stories and videos, which you can check out [here](#).



Cameron's Coffee & Chocolates

[Cameron's Coffee & Chocolates](#) is a business enterprise of the non-profit Every1 Can Work, which was created for the purpose of employing young adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Their shop is located in Fairfax, Virginia, but if you aren't local, they also have an [online shop](#). They sell their house blend coffee, seasoned nuts (including candied balsamic rosemary walnuts – yum), jams, salsa, and even dog treats!

BDelight

[BDelight](#) is an online jewelry shop. It's run by a woman named Ashley, who has quadriplegia and creates beaded items by using a stick attached to her head (you can watch a short clip of her process [here](#)). Her website shows a variety of eye-catching pieces, such as [this](#) "Green Peacock" bracelet and [this](#) "Summer Rose" set. She also takes requests for custom orders!

SpaceTime Coordinates

[SpaceTime Coordinates](#) sells [wall art](#), [clothing](#), and [small mementos](#) that show the exact position of the planets on a particular date and time, using data from NASA. The business was founded by govy, an award-winning French artist who is on the Autism spectrum. The SpaceTime Coordinates website notes that their merchandise "...celebrates humanity and its achievements, either on the historical or personal scale." This would be a great gift for someone who just celebrated a big milestone, such as a wedding or birth, or any other event that is meaningful to them.
