[Bookshare](#): An online library of digital books for people with low vision, learning disabilities, or other disabilities that make it difficult to read standard print.

[Proloquo2Go](#): A symbol-based speech and language app that assists with communication and is customizable for all levels and abilities.



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[Video Scheduler](#): An app that helps with time management and self-discipline through scheduling daily tasks.

[The Sounding Out Machine](#): An assistive reading app that models how to sound out words.

[Super Why! App](#): An interactive literacy app for beginner readers that provides engaging and detailed lessons.

[Thinking Time Pro](#): An early learning app that teaches cognitive skills, logic, and attention skills.

[Kid in Story Book Maker](#): An app that includes social story templates that can be personalized to help a child adapt to new situations or routines.

[Touch and Learn - Emotions](#): An app that helps kids learn emotions through body language and facial expressions.

[Clicker Docs](#): An app that assists with writing, word prediction, and editing, especially for students who struggle in the classroom.

[Time Timer](#): A helpful clock app that offers a visual representation of time to help with productivity and time management.
